

Global Migration Trends

A2K: Access to Knowledge, refers to the right of individuals to access and share knowledge, a concept relevant to global migration trends as migrants often face challenges in accessing information and knowledge in their host countries. Related terms include A2I, or access to information, and the concept of brain drain, where skilled migrants leave their home countries, taking their knowledge and expertise with them.

ABC: Australian Border Control, a term used to describe the border control and immigration policies implemented by the Australian government to manage the flow of migrants into the country. Related terms include border control, visa requirements, and the concept of offshore processing.
